Our Local Policing Charter Pledge

Just a reminder of our Policing promise to the community in which we work.

“There will be a visible policing presence by using local engagement, social media and new digital channels, there will be further opportunities for dialogue so the public can raise concerns, provide feedback, be involved and help shape policing in their area.

These channels will be used to update communities on the activities to keep them safe, and provide information and crime prevention advice”.

The teams hold drop in surgeries across the community so you can have a face to face discussion with team members, this provides a direct contact with a Police Officer or Police Community Support Officer to highlight concerns, discuss ongoing issues, or to have a friendly chat with your local policing team.

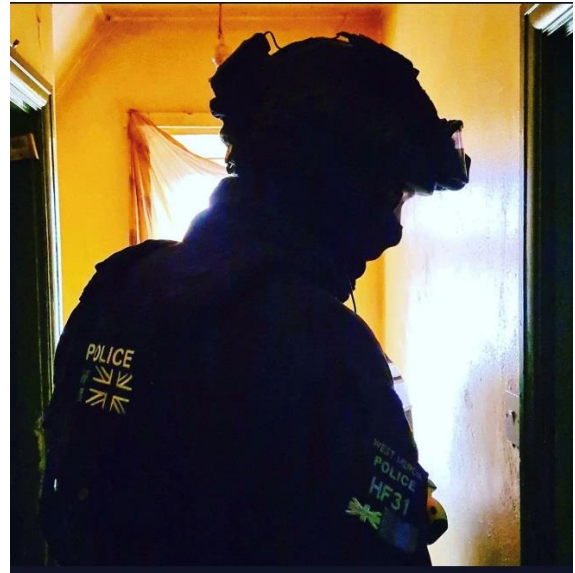
PCSO Karen Kempton has moved from Pershore to work on the Evesham Rural South team, and will assist in the Evesham Town South/Rural West team.

Drugs Warrants



Members from your Evesham and Pershore SNT teams have worked with our dog unit, Task Force (specialist firearms team), and response teams to conduct drugs warrants in Evesham & Pershore.

Having received intelligence from the public allowed us to apply for a drugs warrant from the Magistrates Court, and we are pleased to update the operation was a success. 2 females were arrested from 2 separate addresses for drug related offences, and possession of offensive weapons.

These weapons have been removed during the warrant, together with a quantity of cash which is believed to be gained as part of a drug trafficking enterprise. Removing these weapons keeps the public safe, and we will work hard to ensure the offenders are arrested and placed before the Court.

Community speed watch

What is Community Speed Watch?

Community Speed Watch (CSW) schemes are coordinated by the police but managed and run by volunteers in the community. The scheme enables local people to take an active role in road safety and make their community safer.

The aim of CSW is NOT to catch as many speeding drivers as possible. It aims to encourage motorists to drive at a safe and appropriate speed, reduce speed in areas of concern, re-educate drivers about the dangers of speeding and address concerns from local residents about cars speeding through their neighbourhood.

How does CSW work?

At specified safe locations, volunteers monitor the speed of passing vehicles with a hand-held speed detection device. Offending vehicles' details are recorded on a log sheet, the make/model and registration number of the vehicle and the speed recorded by the hand-held device.

Can anyone become a volunteer?

Schemes are open to anyone aged 17 or over. Volunteers will only be accepted onto a scheme once appropriate checks have been carried out. Volunteers must be able to make a regular commitment to carry out activity and must adhere to the scheme's safety rules at all times. Although reasonable adjustments can be made, volunteers should be mindful of the physical nature of the role.

Training will be provided covering areas such as health and safety, legislation and how to use the speed detection equipment. West Mercia Police reserve the right to withdraw permission for an individual to participate in a local scheme.

Which communities can have a scheme?

There are a number of criteria which must be met before a scheme will be established:

- Speeding must have been identified as a community priority
- Active speed enforcement operations must not already be underway in the area by West Mercia Police
- There must be at least six volunteers in each CSW scheme
- Speed checks must be conducted by at least three volunteers
- The area must have a 30 or 40 mph speed restriction
