Goodbye and Thank You

Road Safety News and Campaigns

Think Bike

The 'Think Bike' has been out and about this year, attending a number of events throughout the force area. One of these events was a ride out to the Valkyrie Bar in Evesham, Worcestershire and was attended by Steve and Safer Neighbourhood Team officers.



NPCC Drink and Drug Driving Operation (Op Limit)



Throughout December, the force is supporting 'Op Limit' - the national drink and drug drive operation. While drink and drug drive enforcement is a 24/7 commitment for West Mercia Police, the month-long operation will involve increased enforcement over the traditional party season as well as messages in the media raising awareness of the dangers of impaired driving.

We are working with Wenlock Spring over the festive period and supporting their 'The Only One for the Road' Christmas campaign. Look out for our logo on Wenlock Spring's vans this month, and promotional materials in pubs and bars.



Be Bright Be Seen

With the darker nights upon us, our Be Bright Be Seen campaign continues and we are reminding all road users to take extra care and share the roads responsibly.

Pedestrians, cyclists and horse riders: Think about how visible you are to other road users. Consider wearing hi-vis clothing and reflective material to ensure you can be seen easily.

Cyclists: Ensure your bike is in good working order. Check your brakes and gears and tyres. If cycling in darkness, make sure your bike has front and rear lights.



Motorists:

- Look carefully for other road users, especially vulnerable road users such as pedestrians and cyclists.
- Ensure your lights are in good working order and your wiper blades work effectively.
- Carry out a winter car check Check brakes, tyres, oil, water, antifreeze and screen wash levels.
- Check your eyesight. Legally, drivers are required to be able to read a number plate 20 metres away, in daylight. If you are struggling, book an eyesight test with an optician.

Mobility scooter users: We have been provided with some Mobility Scooter Safety Packs from Surewise which include road safety advice as well as reflective stickers for mobility scooter users to increase their visibility. Mature Driver Awareness Sessions

Over the last six months, the Road Safety Team have delivered 17 Mature Driver Awareness Sessions, aimed at drivers aged 65+. Events were held in locations across our three counties and delivered in partnership with Hereford & Worcester Fire and Rescue Service, Shropshire Fire Service, Telford & Wrekin Council and YSS charity. Attendees had the chance to watch 'Keep Driving VR' – a virtual reality film tailored for mature drivers. Sessions also focused on issues including eyesight, medication and fatigue.

Local Policing Teams Benefit from New Technology

Following funding by the Police & Crime Commissioner and to support the Commissioner's Safer Communities Plan, policing teams across West Mercia will now have the latest speed enforcement technology available at their fingertips. TruCamII enforcement cameras are being introduced to local policing teams to give a further capability for enforcement in areas that are causing the most community concern.

TruCamII cameras can be used as either handheld devices by officers or on a tripod,





allowing greater flexibility on sites where they can be used. The equipment has the ability to capture and process offences much quicker than older devices and produces higher quality,



clearer pictures of offending vehicles and therefore ensures a more efficient use of officers' time and a more effective court process.

Telford & Wrekin local policing teams are the first areas to be using the new equipment across the force area, which has been made possible due to funding through the Telford & Wrekin Council Safer Stronger programme. The use of this new technology will be rolled out across other areas of West Mercia in due course.
